New Business:

Resolution: To approve one time sewer relief in the amount of \$160.34 to Zach and Jodie Russell 42 Church Street for a pool filling secondary to a leak.

Resolution: To approve one time sewer relief in the amount of \$1,060.90 to Leslie and Melanie Hoopes 50 Church Street for a pool filling secondary to a leak.

Resolution: To approve one time sewer relief in the amount of \$659.12 to Brian Lossow of 79 Kinderhook Street for a furnace boiler leak.

Resolution: To approve the reimbursement of \$58.79 to Christine Trienens for an overpayment due to an over estimation of her water usage during a time the DPW could not access her meter.

Resolution: To accept and authorize the Mayor to sign the proposal dated September 3, 2020 from Berkshire Fence Company for the purchase and installation of a 410 linear foot, eight foot high commercial grade galvanized chain link fence at a cost of \$15,500 for the new water storage tank at Dinegar Avenue.

Resolution: To accept the proposal dated September 9, 2020 from Oakwood Fencing for the purchase and installation of a 400+/- linear foot, eight foot high commercial grade galvanized chain link fence at a cost of \$15,500 for the new water storage tank at Dinegar Avenue.

Resolution:

Whereas, section 1200 of the NYS Vehicle & Traffic Law provides that "when official signs have been posted prohibiting, restricting or limiting the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles on any highway, no person shall stop, stand or park any vehicle in violation of the restrictions stated on such signs"; and

Whereas, section 99-31 of the Chatham Village Code provides that the Police Department shall have the power and authority to provide for the removal of vehicles parked on any highway in violation of any statute, ordinance, rule or regulation and further provides that such removal may be by means of towing and that such removal and storage shall be at the expense and risk of the owner of the vehicle; and

Whereas, in order to enable the scheduled resurfacing of certain Village streets on or about September 15 to September 16, 2020, official signs posted by the Village of Chatham Police Department and/or Department of Public Works have been posted prohibiting parking on such streets during specified times; and

Whereas, parking in violation of such signs posted by the Village of Chatham would constitute a violation of section 1200 of the NYS Vehicle & Traffic Law,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Chatham Police shall provide for the removal and storage, at the vehicle owner's expense, of any vehicle parked on the streets and during the times specified in the schedule below, in violation of official signs prohibiting such parking that have been placed by the Village of Chatham.

Parking is prohibited on Thursday, September 17, 2020 for the following streets from 4:00 AM to 6:00 PM.

Cemetery Hill
Maiden Lane
School Street
Thomas Street
Harmon heights
Locust Street
Shore Road
Eaton Avenue

In the event of rain on Thursday, September 17, such parking prohibition shall be extended to the period from 4:00 AM to 6:00 PM on Monday, September 21.
