NEW BUSINESS:

<u>Resolution 172 of 2024</u> – To approve, and authorize the Mayor to sign the CDPHP New York State <u>Small Group Recertification</u> for <u>Dental</u> health insurance <u>January 1, 2025</u> through <u>December 31, 2025</u>. (to certify that we are eligible for small group rates)

<u>Resolution 173 of 2024</u> – To approve, and authorize the Mayor to sign the MVP New York State <u>Small Group Recertification</u> for <u>Medical</u> health insurance <u>January 1, 2025</u> through <u>December 31, 2025</u>. (to certify that we are eligible for small group rates)

<u>Resolution 174 of 2024</u> - To approve the renewal of the MVP Liberty Silver 3 EPO <u>Medical</u> health insurance plan, effective January 1, 2025, at an increase of \$16,024.08, approximately 13.7% higher than last year. (renewal of current plan, same benefits)

Resolution 175 of 2024 - To approve the renewal of the CDPHP/*Delta Dental* insurance plan effective January 1, 2025, with no change in benefits, and no increase in premium from last year.

<u>Resolution 176 of 2024</u> - To authorize the Mayor to sign a *renewal* "Agreement For Administrative Services" (<u>Health Reimbursement Account</u>) between **Brown and Brown** Insurance and the Village of Chatham, for the term of January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025, with no changes from current agreement.

Resolution 177 of 2024 - to approve the CPD purchase of a 2025 Dodge Durango PPV from Central Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram of Raynham, in the amount of \$50,866.03, per Quote/Bid # TB5130, dated 11/06/2024. (includes *some* upfitting)

Resolution 178 of 2024 - to approve the Purchase of POLICE CAR RADIO for \$1310.25 from River Valley Radio, per Quote #m5134, dated11/5/2024. (radio only, not installed)

Resolution 179 of 2024 - to approve UPFITTING of the CPD 2025 Dodge Durango PPV for \$11,700.96 by Redlyne Performance per Quote #18111, dated 10/14/2024. (includes installation of radio)

Resolution 180 of 2024 - to designate Austerlitz Street as a "local traffic only" street.

<u>Resolution 181 of 2024 -</u> to authorize CPD to request a **traffic study** of the **Austerlitz St** and Spring St intersection from NYS DOT.

Resolution 182 of 2024 in Support of Continued and Increased State Aid for Local Governments...

Whereas, until 2024, cities, villages and towns had not received an increase in unrestricted state aid (AIM funding) in 15 years, significantly impacting their ability to provide essential services to their residents; and

Whereas, after a prolonged period without financial support, local governments finally received an increase of \$50 million in unrestricted state aid; and

Whereas, local officials express their gratitude for the \$50 million increase in unrestricted state aid, recognizing it as a positive step towards addressing long-standing funding challenges; and

Whereas, the State has referred to this new aid as Temporary Municipal Assistance, suggesting that such increase may not continue, jeopardizing the sustainability of crucial municipal programs and services; and

Whereas, the property tax cap further limits the ability of local governments to properly fund the programs and services their residents need; and

Whereas, increased and ongoing state aid for local governments is vital for maintaining infrastructure, public safety, housing and other municipal services; and

Whereas, the challenges of inflation, the increasing costs of labor and supplies, and the end of extraordinary federal aid only accentuate the need for consistent and predictable funding to effectively plan for the future and meet the growing needs of their residents;

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Village of Chatham calls upon the Governor and the State Legislature to commit to continuing the additional \$50 million in unrestricted state aid in the 2025-26 State Budget and beyond, and

Be it further resolved, that the Village of Chatham urges state officials to recognize the need for a long-term plan that ensures consistent and predictable increases in financial support for local governments that keep pace with inflation.

<u>Resolution 183 of 2024</u> - to approve the transfer of funds in the amount of \$86.00 from line 51104.01 (General Repairs Contractual) to 51104.01 (General Repairs Office) to cover the cost of **emails and office 365 installation for the DPW computer**.

Resolution 184 of 2024 - to approve the transfer of funds in the amount of \$3,000.00 from line 31204.01 (Police Child Seat Grant) to 31204.01 (Police Supplies and Materials) to cover the cost of ammo purchased from the Town of Schodack for training purposes.

Resolution 185 of 2024 - To approve the use of funds in the Hudson and Houseman Avenue Water Main Reserve Fund in the amount of \$4,859.03 to cover invoices for purchases made from September to October, which were applied to the Village Budget line 83402 (Transmission Equipment), and is reflected as item "G" on the October Budget to Actual report.

Resolution 186 of 2024 - To Amend the Budget for use of the Unappropriated Fund Balance...

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees resolved on January 8, 2024 to use the unappropriated balance to fund the project known as the **Chatham Municipal Well Assessment, a mandatory redundant water source**; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Village Law section 5-520, appropriation of the necessary funds may be made by transferring available funds from the unappropriated fund balance if the water fund and such unappropriated fund balance contains sufficient funds for such appropriation and transfer;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the 2024-25 Village of Chatham Water Fund budget is hereby amended and modified as follows:

- -Assigned Appropriated Fund Balance Revenue Line is increased by three thousand one hundred dollars (\$3,100.00)
- -Appropriation to expense line 83404 (Transmission Contract) is increased by three thousand one hundred dollars (\$3,100.00)
- -Unappropriated unreserved fund balance is reduced by three thousand one hundred dollars (\$3,100.00)
- -All necessary sums and totals of budgeted appropriations and revenues shall be adjusted accordingly.
